In a rural village outside of Machakos, Kenya — **gravity is defied**. This phenomenon happens as there is no gravity in the Mua Hills leading into Machakos. What does this mean? When a bottle of water is poured onto the road, it flows uphill. Cars also roll up the hill without being turned on.

What is supposed to be impossible becomes **POSSIBLE!**

New Vision is partnering with Compassion International to bring solar lights to developing communities around the world. The **Light Up Machakos** project is located within a Compassion International sponsorship community southeast of Nairobi, Kenya. By providing a New Vision Portable Solar Power Pack & Light, the smell and dangers of kerosene would become a memory. Families spend over \$100 per year for kerosene fuel for lighting. The United Nations Foundation reports that one million people suffer severe burns from kerosene spills each year, not to mention the severe respiratory and vision problems from breathing in the toxic fumes.

There sits a school in a rural village near Machakos that educates these children on a daily basis. Hope fills the air as students make their way into their school. However, that hope tends to go down as the sun does each night. As each of these children gather in their home every night, their only light comes from the toxic fumes of a kerosene flame that is their main source of light. The dim light produces a toxic smell that these children breathe in each night as they attempt to do their homework so they can further their education. Can you only imagine how your donation can help these children of Machakos? Clean light, clean air and a better education!

On April, 23rd 2013, college students from all over the United States took a stand to push back the darkness so that these children can blow out their kerosene flames for the last time. On college campuses all over the country, students made solar LED lights that would light up the night for each one of these children. In partnership with New Vision Renewable Energy, students made the lights that will light up an entire room and replace the kerosene lanterns. As each light was built at the colleges that night, the rooms started to brighten up. By the end of the night, each room was full of light and a new hope as the excitement grew.
